Additional CLAW Institute Participant details:

- Faculty can only enroll in one professional development institute per academic year (CETO, GAIT, OCAI, CLAW, or ACUE).
- Participants who receive a score of 80% or higher will receive a \$750 professional development stipend which will be sent to departments upon completion of the course, in addition to earning a CLAW Institute certificate and badge.

- Participants will be asked to commit to approximately 2 hours per week for the duration of the semester.
- All course assignments must be submitted by 11:59 PM Friday, November 14th.
- The CLAW Institute is a hybrid learning community with synchronous meetings and is not self-paced or asynchronous.
- Participants will be asked to attend the synchronous meetings (in person and virtual):
 - o In-person meetings will take place on Wednesdays (9/10 & 11/5) 11:00-12:00 location TBA o Virtual meetings will take place on Wednesdays (9/24, 10/8, 10/22) 11:00-12:00 on Zoom
- The CLAW Institute will launch with a virtual orientation on Wednesday, August 27th 11:00-12:00 and will end with a virtual certificate ceremony Wednesday, November 19th 11:00-12:00.
- The application will close on Friday, May 9th. There is a limited number of spots available in the cohort.
- Participants will be notified of their acceptance no later than Friday, May 16th.
- Department chair signatures will be required on all participant applications.
